

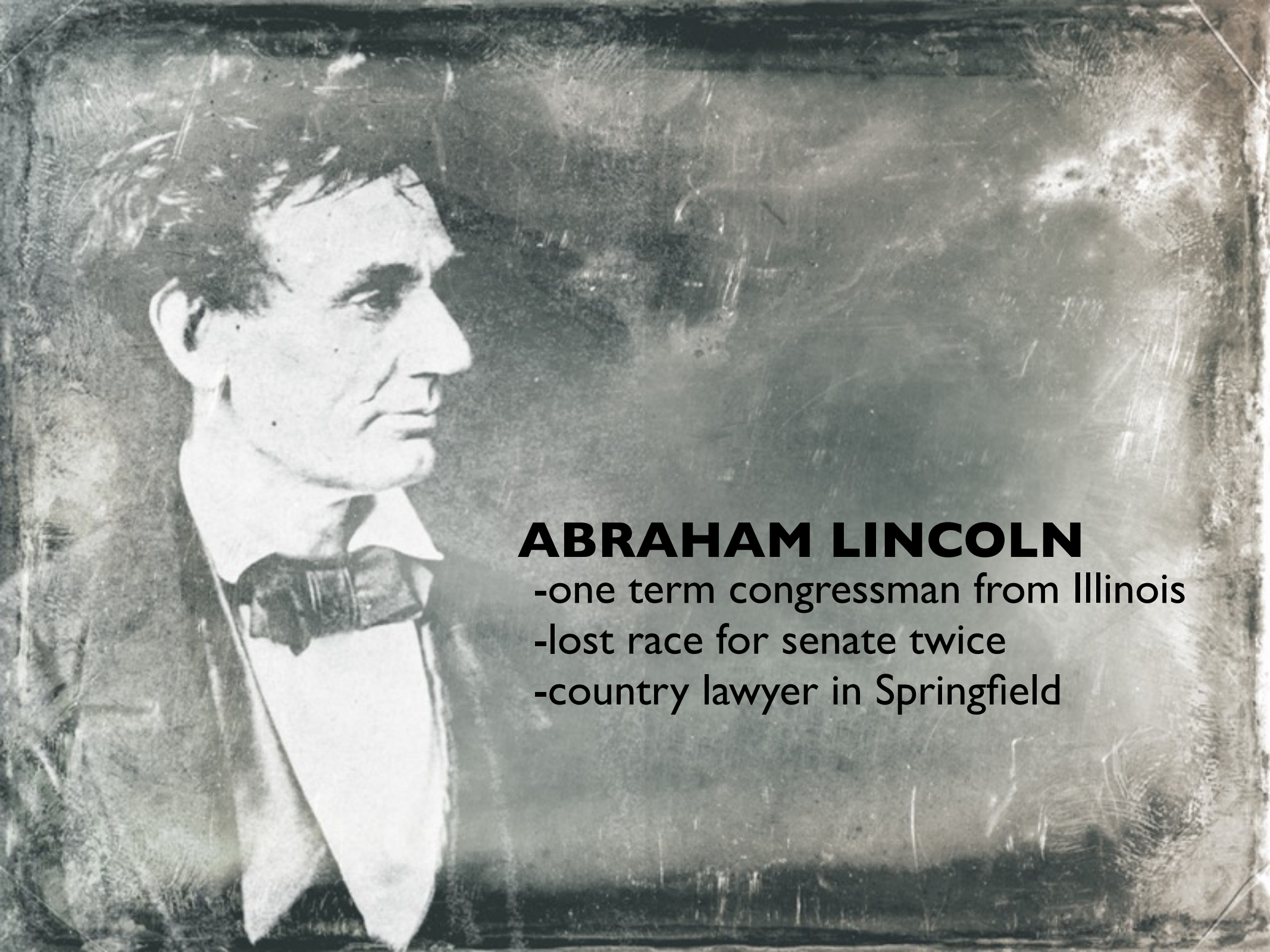






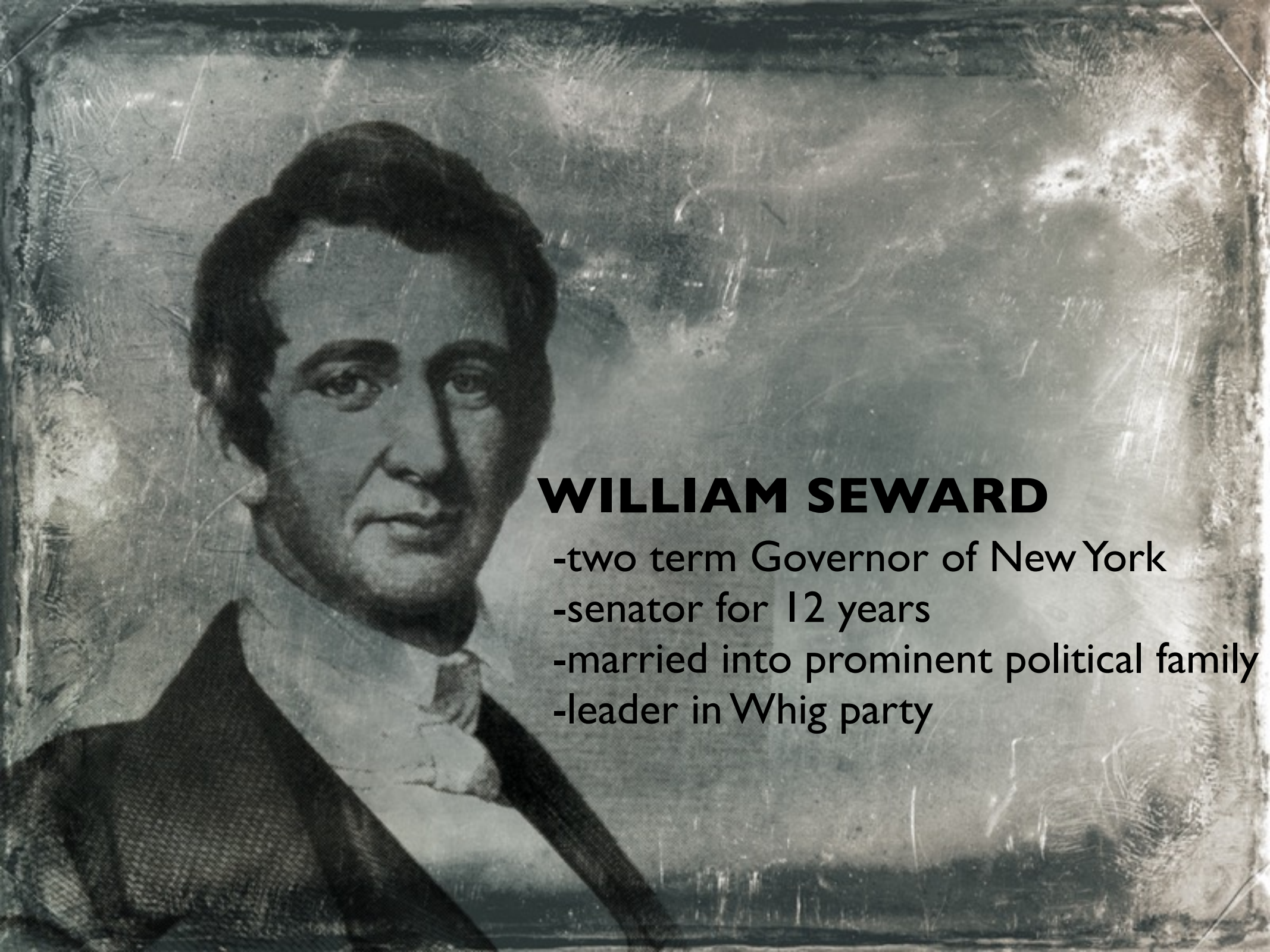


ABRAHAM LINCOLN - TEAM OF RIVALS



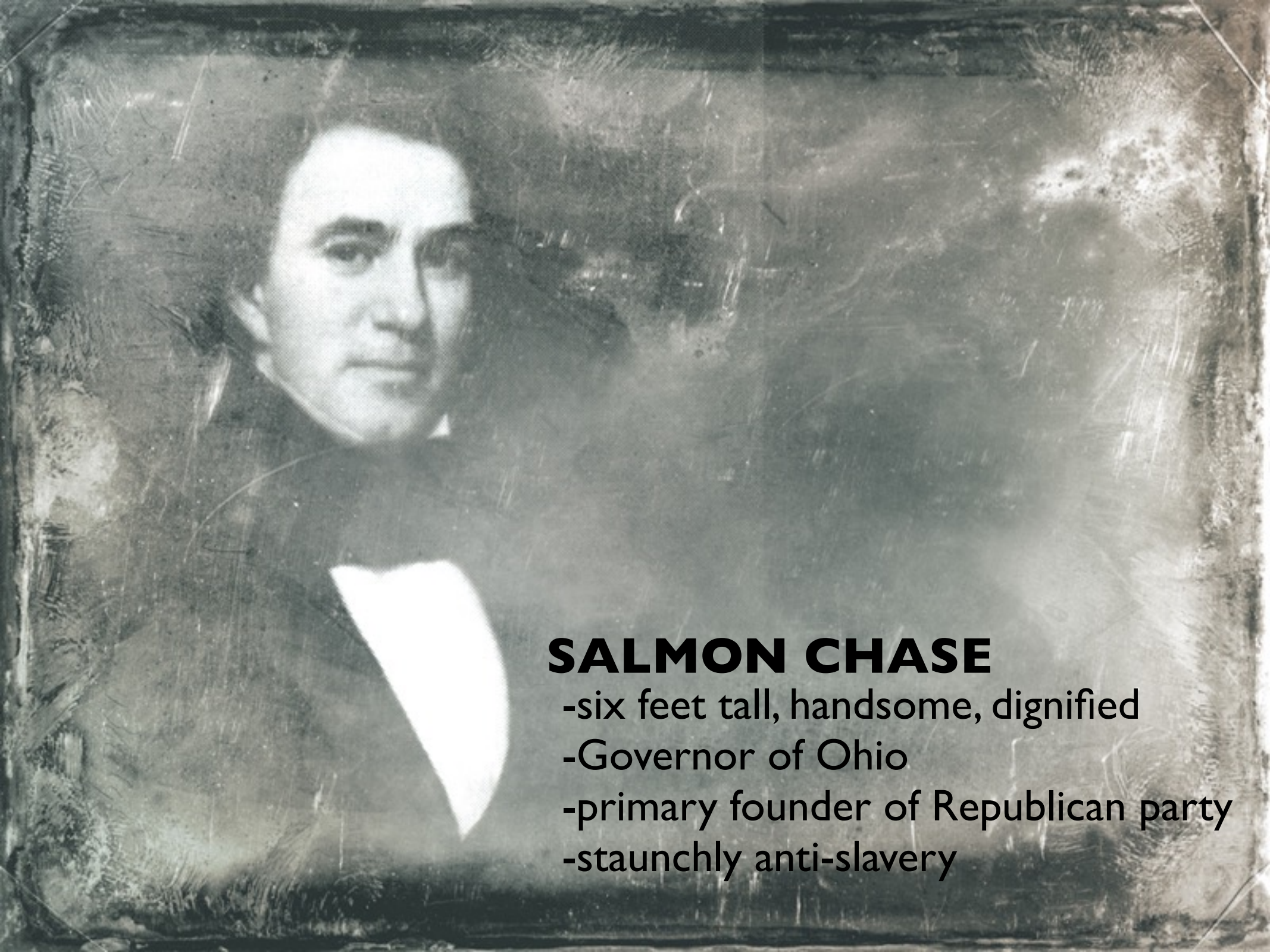
ABRAHAM LINCOLN

- one term congressman from Illinois
- lost race for senate twice
- country lawyer in Springfield



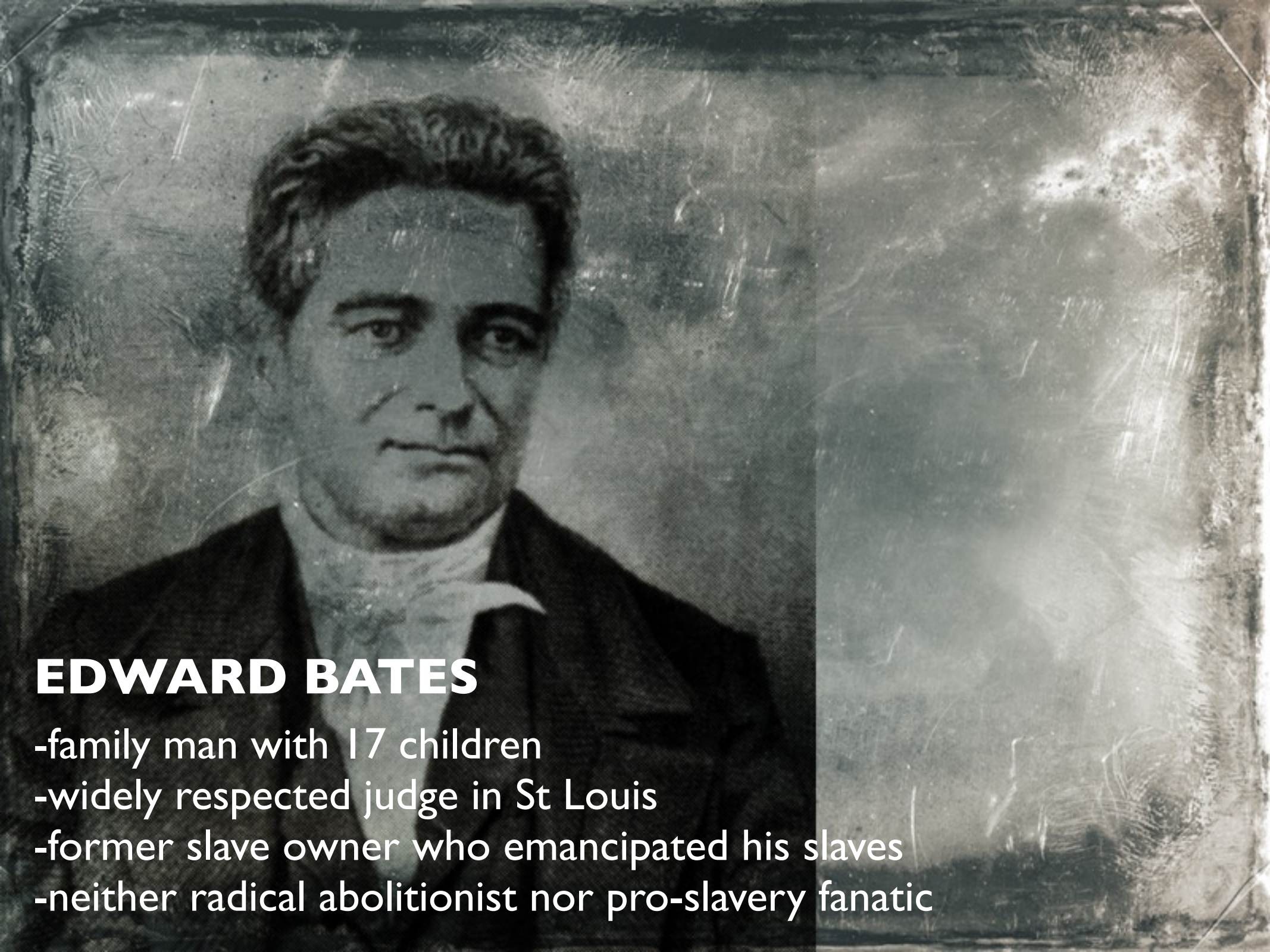
WILLIAM SEWARD

- two term Governor of New York
- senator for 12 years
- married into prominent political family
- leader in Whig party



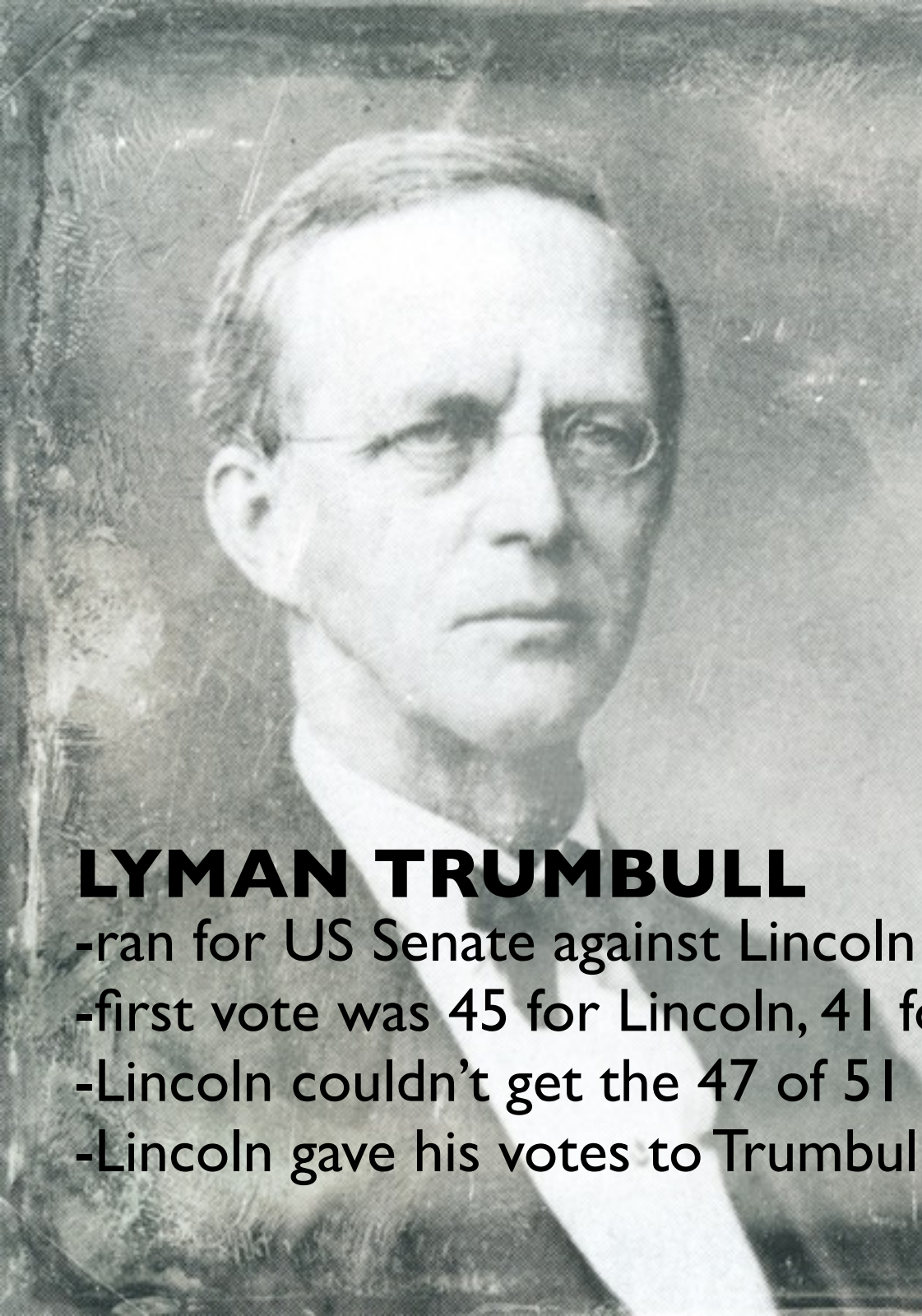
SALMON CHASE

- six feet tall, handsome, dignified
- Governor of Ohio
- primary founder of Republican party
- staunchly anti-slavery



EDWARD BATES

- family man with 17 children
- widely respected judge in St Louis
- former slave owner who emancipated his slaves
- neither radical abolitionist nor pro-slavery fanatic



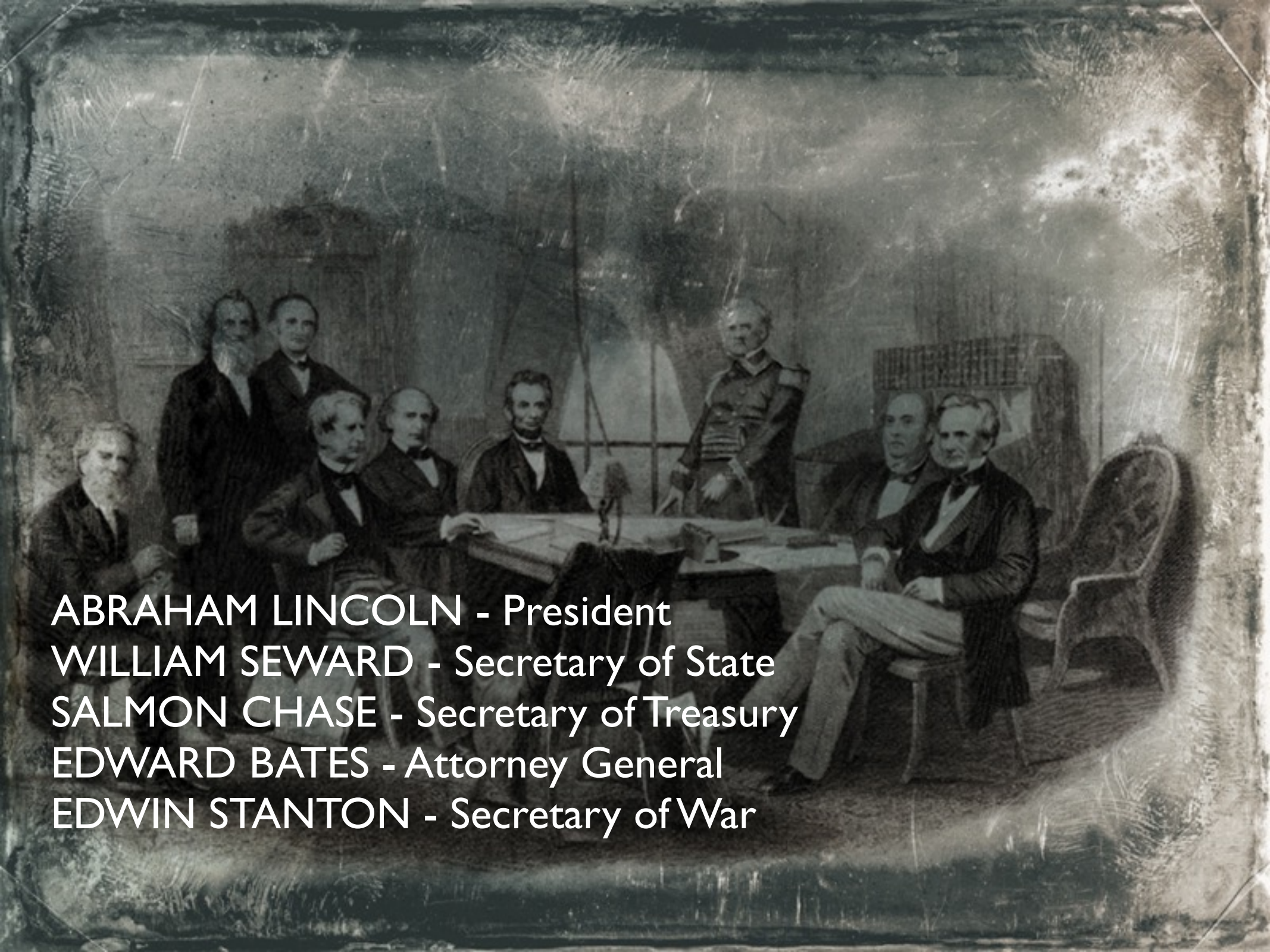
LYMAN TRUMBULL

- ran for US Senate against Lincoln in 1855
- first vote was 45 for Lincoln, 41 for Democrat, 5 for Trumbull
- Lincoln couldn't get the 47 of 51 needed; Trumbull wouldn't budge
- Lincoln gave his votes to Trumbull so he could win



EDWIN STANTON

- Lincoln chosen to represent McCormick in lawsuit in Chicago
- venue moved to Cincinnati
- Edwin got Lincoln fired from case
