

Pecha Kucha Presentation

As a complement to your Think Sheets, you will be asked to present on your building as a Pecha Kucha. Pecha Kucha is a Japanese word (meaning chit-chat) for a presentation that is structured to control the flow of information.

FORMAT: 10 X 20

You will be doing half a Pecha Kucha. Normal Pecha Kucha presentations are 20X20 (20 slides, 20 seconds each). The format of your presentation is an automated flow of 10 images or slides that are timed at 20 seconds each.

CONTENT

The content of your Pecha Kucha is up to you. Remember, 10 slides does not lend itself to multiple topics, so try and narrow your focus to one particular aspect of your building that you find interesting. Avoid "Wikipedia" presentations (book report presentations that summarize the basic facts of your building).

IMAGES

This is an opportunity to make something beautiful, as well as make something informative. Use all the resources available to you to put together your slides. Original content is encouraged, and will result in higher marks. Please use high-quality images. No text please.

ORATION

It is essential to rehearse your presentation. While we don't expect you to be perfect, we do expect you to have some control over what you are trying to say. Relying on the images solely as a way of moving along will be challenging for you and your audience. Engage your audience directly, and smile!

EVALUATION

A: rehearsed, well spoken, beautiful + informative imagery, cohesive, and actively seeking discovery.

B: controlled, some roughness in delivery, adequate imagery, informative, but not very discursive.

C: mediocre, clumsy delivery, weak image selection, little discourse or engagement. D/F: poorly prepared, poor image selection, no discourse or engagement.
